Format:

2 Ball, Better Ball, Stableford (7/8 Handicaps).

Tee Box: White Tee - Men, Red Tees - Women.

Handicap rules:

Each player will play off **7/8** of his/her handicap. Maximum **7/8** allowed for both men and ladies is **27**. After this calculation the total of the team's combined handicap cannot exceed **40**. In the event the combined total crosses 40, the higher handicap will be reduced to conform to this rule. If anyone does not have a confirmed index from a TTGA affiliated Club or a foreign home Club, this player will be assigned a scratch handicap by the Tournament Committee.

Women will receive 2 additional shots to their handicap before the 7/8 conversion, as the Ladies Red Tee course rating is 71.5 where the Men's White Tee course rating is 69.7.

Pace of play:

A foursome is expected to complete their 18 holes round in 4hrs, 30 mins. Penalty strokes will be administered for slow play. After your first warning you will be given 3 holes to catch up to the group ahead of you. In the interest of speeding up the pace of play, you are asked to pick up your ball when you know your score cannot be counted.

Scoring:

1. Record both gross scores on each hole.
2. Select the better net score of the two players and record this on the card.
3. On a separate line below write in the number of stableford points. Calculate this based on the best Net score. Use the stableford points guide below. If a player picks up on a hole simply write in a dash (-) for him/her.

Stableford points system:

Net bogey =1 point, Net par =2 points, Net birdie =3 points, Net eagle =4 points.

Use the handicap rating on each hole on the scorecard to determine where you get your strokes.

Please note that the women stroke holes are different from the men's.

Please note: If in doubt of your handicap, please check with Delano Otero before signing your scorecard.

Prizes are as follows:

- The first 14 teams
- Nearest to the pin on all four par three's.
- Best dressed team.

There are no individual or team gross prizes.

Breaking of ties:

The ranking of tied scores will be decided by a stroke hole count-back beginning with stroke hole 1, if still tied stroke hole 2, if still tied stroke hole 3, and so on until a winner is determined. Please note the men's **HSI** will be used for men's and mixed teams and the ladies' **HSI** will be used for teams consisting two (2) ladies. ***In the event of rain, please refer to below – Incomplete Round.***

Incomplete Round

If the tournament succumbs to heavy rain and play can not continue due to unplayable conditions, the minimum number of holes played by all teams will be selected and the highest amount of points achieved on the selected minimum holes will count. The minimum holes selected for each team will begin from the hole the team started on. For example, If the minimum holes played is 7 and your team played holes 1 to 9. Holes 1 to 7 will be selected as the minimum holes played on your card. If there are ties, the lowest stroke hole played by each team will be selected and the highest points achieved will win. The process of comparing the hardest hole played by each team will continue until a winner is determined.

LOCAL RULES 2018

The Rules of Golf of the R&A as modified by the following LOCAL RULES will apply.

Preferred Lies	<p>On the fairway in play the ball may be lifted without penalty, cleaned and placed within 12" of its original position, not nearer the hole. The ball must be marked before it is lifted. After it has been <u>placed and comes to rest, the ball is in play.</u></p> <p>When in doubt, always check with your marker <u>before</u> you lift your ball.</p>
Embedded Ball	<p><u>Through the green except for in hazards</u>, a ball that is embedded in its own pitch-mark in the ground may be lifted, without penalty, cleaned and dropped as near as possible to where it lay but not nearer the hole and not on a green.</p>
IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS	<p>All man-made structures such as paved walkways, roadways, bridges, steps, sheds, advertising signs, sprinkler heads and their indentations, concrete drains and covers, yardage markers. Unpaved roadways and walkways defined by blue paint are also immovable obstructions. See Rule 24-2b for procedure on relief.</p> <p>Other obstructions to note: WASA well between 1st Green and 9th Tee Footbridge on the 1st / 9th rough. Note that the sewer plant on the 8th, the WASA well-head and the cell tower on the 12th hole are in the hazard.</p>
COURSE MARKINGS	<p>Lateral Hazards: Defined by red stakes</p> <p>Water Hazards: defined by yellow stakes</p> <p>Ground Under Repair: Usually defined by white markings on the ground. Out Of Bounds: Defined by white stakes and/or white paint. On the 8th hole, the fence alongside the tee-box and the near edge of the road mark the out of bounds. Areas beyond the road, even if on another part of the course, are also out of bounds.</p>
BUNKERS	<p>In a bunker, stones/pebbles may be removed and, if the ball moves, it must be replaced. A ball coming to rest in an eroded area may be lifted, cleaned and dropped within one club length of the nearest point of relief within the bunker and not nearer the hole. See Rule 25-1(b) (ii) for procedure for abnormal conditions in a bunker.</p>
12th hole concrete drain	<p>A ball that lies in the drain may be lifted and dropped back in play within one club length of the nearest point of relief at the point of entry agreed between the player and his/her marker.</p>
Distance Measuring Devices	<p>Devices that measure only distance are permitted.</p>
Cell Phones	<p>Except in the case of an emergency call out, the use of cell phones is prohibited and may result in disqualification.</p>
Putting Green	<p>All players are allowed to fix any and all indentations on the putting green including spike marks.</p>
Danger Zones	<p>Major erosion / damage has resulted in some areas near to WATER HAZARDS (yellow) and LATERAL WATER HAZARDS (red) to be of major safety concerns. These areas on holes 8, 9, 10 11, and 16 have been deemed "AREAS OF DANGER" and will be demarcated with ORANGE lines. Players are not allowed to stand within or play from within these demarcated areas. Once the ball or your stance is touching or within these ORANGE lines or these lines are interfering with the area of intended stance the player MUST take relief, without penalty, a drop (20-2) at the NEAREST POINT OF RELIEF (25-1b). Failure to take the prescribed relief will attract a 2 shot penalty.</p>
